**Nik Wallenda, King of the High Wire completes  
'Wheel of Death' stunt at Tropicana Atlantic City**  
*Daredevil stunts to be filmed for television series*

**ATLANTIC CITY, NJ (April 29, 2011)** – Nik Wallenda, a seventh generation member of the legendary “Flying Wallendas” circus family, performed two death-defying stunts today at the Tropicana Casino and Resort on Friday, April 29, 2011.

The first stunt, a high wire walk, was done in Fiesta Plaza, The Quarter at 11 am, approximately 56 ft. above hundreds of onlookers standing behind stanchions and from the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of The Quarter.

The second stunt, dubbed the “Wheel of Death” was performed from the top of the 23<sup>rd</sup> story of the South Tower at Tropicana. The “Wheel of Death” is large rotating apparatus on which highly-skilled performers execute acrobatic feats. It is essentially a 50 foot steel frame with an 8 foot wheel at one end. It is the first time this stunt was ever performed from the top and off the sides of a building.

Hundreds of people lined the Boardwalk and beaches adjacent to the Tropicana to witness the stunt on a picture-perfect spring day.

The stunt was filmed by an independent production company for a reality television series that will air in summer of 2011.

Wallenda’s April 29 stunt at Tropicana was the first time a “Wheel of Death” stunt has ever been performed from off the side of a building. Nik Wallenda set a *Guinness World Record* in October 15, 2008, for the longest distance and greatest height ever traveled by bicycle on a high wire live on the *Today Show*.

He has since broken both of those Guinness Records at the Atlantis in Nassau, the Bahamas, in August 2010.
